LOUDfence Mass at St. David's Cathedral celebratedy by Archbishop Mark O'Toole on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> October at 12 noon

What is LOUDfence? LOUDfence, a survivor-led initiative, gives a voice to all those who have experienced abuse within a faith-based setting or have been affected by it, although it is open to everyone. LOUDfence provides an opportunity for reflection on the times the Church and wider society has failed victims/survivors of abuse and to say we are truly sorry. It enables us to commit ourselves to doing our utmost to being a place which is safe for allpeople. LOUDfence is a process which aids gradual culture transformation through celebrating the virtues we hold valuable. LOUDfence raises awareness in the community and in institutions, it challenges the silence and shame which surrounds the issue of abuse. LOUDfence seeks to support the survivor and validate their worth by celebrating the act of speaking out and truth telling.

The Licence in Divinity: Pathway in Catechetical Sciences is another qualification of the Holy See, distinct from an STL, it is a three-year, part-time, programme aimed at those in leadership positions in catechetics and in other positions of responsibility. **Easter Offering Envelopes**: are at the back of the Church. The Easter Collection is your offering to the Priest and forms an essential part of his income.

<u>Hospital Chaplaincy</u>: Please note the following information when anyone from our community is admitted to hospital: If you are aware of routine procedures which will require your stay in hospital, and would like to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Communion or the Sick please contact Fr. Lawrence so that appropriate arrangements can be made before your admission to hospital. At the present time it may not be possible to offer this ministry in hospital for planned procedures. In the case of emergency admissions, the onus is entirely on the patient and/or family member to note the following directives:

• In the case of Neville Hall, please ask staff to contact Father Carney, or you may do so directly on 01873 851051.

- In the case of the Royal Gwent, please ask staff to contact the on-call Catholic Chaplain.
- In the case of Panteg Hospital or The Grange, please ask staff to contact Fr. Lawrence or you may contact me directly.

<u>Holy Communion at home</u>: If you would like to receive Holy Communion at home, please contact Father Lawrence so that appropriate arrangements can be made.

<u>A.P.F.</u>: Margaret Vidler asks for the Red Boxes to be brought to Church for emptying in the near future. <u>Sacrament of Reconciliation</u>: St Alban's on Wednesday from 6.30 – 6.55 p.m. and by arrangement with Canon David.

As this has been highlighted as an important part of our community's outreach, we would welcome more people to go on a rota to help deliver the collection to the foodbank. Please let Canon David know when you are willing to help.

**Holy Communion at home:** If at the present time, you feel unable to re-join the parish community for Sunday Mass (or weekday Mass when there are fewer people present), and would like to receive Holy Communion at home, please contact Canon David so that appropriate arrangements can be made.

<u>Housekeeper</u> for the Presbytery, mainly for cleaning and ironing – 3 hours per week. Please see Fr. David for more details.

<u>Children's Liturgy</u>: if there are children in St Felix this weekend, there will be Children's Liturgy at Mass. Unfortunately, no one has volunteered to assist with restarting this in St Alban's at the present time.

**THE BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT GROUP** is a small team of parishioners who offer confidential help and support to families or individuals who have suffered the death of a loved one. The team offer support to the bereaved throughout the whole of St. Albans parish. Would you be interested in joining the group?

Baptismal Certificates: These are required prior to the celebration of First Holy Communion, Confirmation or Marriage, so as to confirm membership of the Church. They are sometimes asked for by Schools or the Local Authority too, but always to confirm a spiritual bond with Jesus and his Church. Is this always why parents ask for a copy of a certificate? Or is it just for admission to school or a free bus pass? Remember that at the Celebration of Baptism you undertook a solemn promise before God to bring up your child as a Catholic, and this includes attendance at Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion! As family, school and parish we work together for the spiritual development of your children! Don't deprive your child of getting to know the person of Jesus by forgetting your obligations!

<u>Caring for those who cared – The Work of the Clergy Welfare Board</u>: A retiring collection will be held in this Parish **this weekend**. This will be allocated to the Clergy Retirement Fund. Gift Aid envelopes are at the back of the Church so that the offerings of taxpayers may be increased by 25%. Please give as generously as you can.

**Qualities necessary?** To have been confirmed yourself. To have a desire to live a Catholic life and to be a witness to others. <u>Church cleaning at St Alban's:</u> There is a desperate need for help in cleaning our Churches. CAN YOU COMMIT to being on a rota once in six weeks? There is no minimum age (within reason!!) and neither is there a restriction on it normally being done by female members of the parish! Please sign the list at the back of the Church if you can help so that a rota may be made.

<u>Confession</u> is one of the great Sacraments of love and healing. Through this Sacrament we receive God's deep, loving and absolute mercy when we turn to him and present our shortfalls, our failings, the little and the great things we have done wrong. The Church is often accused of being too rigorist and unrelenting, but what she presents to us is the ideal to strive towards. Not one of us is perfect and we all need the Sacrament of Reconciliation in this life to strengthen and renew us and to hear the words 'you are forgiven, it is forgotten, you are ALIVE'

<u>Could you help to clean our church</u>? The list of cleaners has been decimated by sickness and age. Would you be willing to go on a rota which would mean you would have to help to clean the church about once every 6 to 7 weeks. Please give your name to any member of the UCM.

<u>Crib Offerings</u>: The offering this year will be to support local homeless people. Amazing Grace Spaces is a charity that creates safe sleeping places for the homeless (sleeping pods). They are seeking funding to create as many safe sleeping places for rough sleepers in Newport as possible. As we recall this Christmas how there was "no room" for Jesus, Mary & Joseph, let's look towards providing immediate aid to the growing homeless population in Newport. Each sleeping pod costs £5,500. ## Cycle of Prayer:

**Eucharistic Adoration:** as we remember, this has been an important part of our spiritual lives in our parish for many years, and has been the source of many graces and blessings for those whose intentions have been brought before the Lord in prayer. During these challenging times, to be still in the presence of the Lord is an oasis of peace and prayer, and affords us the opportunity to not just pray for one another, but particularly for all who are affected by the virus in any way; that all may recognise the part which each one of us should fulfil in reducing the impact of the virus in our community. At the current time, we have Adoration for one hour every Monday after Mass; can you spend an hour in prayer before the Lord?

"Instructions for my Funeral Mass": Ever wondered how to let your family know your wishes? This leaflet, produced by the Catholic Church in England and Wales, helps to help make it easier for our family or our friends to arrange our funeral at what will be a sad and difficult time for them. Too often the issue of death is considered a taboo subject in our secular society. But in the light of our Catholic faith it is one which we should all have the confidence to face as the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead on Easter Sunday transforms our understanding of death. Faith tells us, that through our baptism we already share in that risen life of the Lord. This is a bond that nothing - including death - can ever destroy. Please consider asking for a copy from the back of the Church. The cost is only £1 each and will help to ease the burden on our loved ones.

**Parish Advisory Council:** The community at St. Felix does not have a representative on the Council at the moment. Meetings are held every two months. Not a time-consuming commitment but important for the Blaenavon community to be represented! Interested? Please speak to Fr. David for more information!
